Dear Members, Supporters, Patrons, and Neighbors,

2022 was the 120th anniversary of the Helen Kate Furness Free Library, and what a banner year it was! With your engagement, we hit new records in Library utilization with over 105,000 items checked out. The Board of Directors set an aspirational fundraising target of \$120,000 for the Library's 120th anniversary and to help close what we anticipated to be a significant operating budget gap, and we exceeded it! We put the Library on track to meet state-mandated requirements around staffing and investment in our collections. We strengthened our partnership with Nether Providence Township and the Rose Valley Borough Council, and both committed to increased annual contributions to the Library for 2023. We used ARPA funds awarded to us by the Nether Providence Township to beautify the Library grounds by replacing a deteriorating fence and taking down unhealthy trees. And so much more!

For the first time since March 2020, the Board of Directors was able to hold in-person fundraising events like Well Red, and wow, did the community turn out! We are so grateful for the strong engagement from our community. It is your generosity that allows us to continue to invest in the gem that is the Helen Kate Furness Free Library.

We are also so fortunate for the dedicated and passionate staff and volunteers operating our Library day in and day out. Thank you to our Library Director, Leah Kulikowski, our staff librarians, Lori Friedgen-Veitch, Molly Deutsch, Laura Gandia, Meg Hawkins, and Beth Noto; and to all of our volunteers! You are the warm, creative, and knowledgeable engine that keeps our Library thriving and meeting the needs of our community.

Thank you, and we look forward to your continued patronage in 2023!

New fence and tree work

Dear Helen Kate Supporters and Patrons,

This year was the 120th anniversary of the Helen Kate Furness Free Library. In many ways, this has been a celebratory year, as we've made meaningful investments towards staffing,

cultivating the library collection, programs and events, and maintaining our building and grounds.

We now have 4 full-time librarians on staff, which has enabled us to expand and increase the quality of our services to the community. This year we offered 193 library programs for 3,903 community members of all ages. Children's programs included early literacy storytimes, scavenger hunts, art contests, outdoor movies, and STEM activities. Adults participated in monthly book discussions, a spring plant exchange, a Sandi Nailor Memorial Author Talk featuring Allison Buccola, a local author fair, art and craft workshops, and sessions on college application prep, beekeeping, and native trees.

We have continued to add quality materials to our collections with a focus on diversity. We replaced well-loved but worn classics and added a local author collection to highlight literary talent in Delaware County. Demand for eBooks has soared in recent years (demand is up nearly 60% since pre-pandemic), so we joined Overdrive Advantage and began purchasing eBooks in order to give Helen Kate patrons access to high-demand eBook titles and reduce hold list wait times. We broke our circulation records in July and August of this year, with over 10,000 items checked out each month. In total this year, 105,465 books, eBooks, and other materials were checked out from our library.


Thank you for being a part of our library community. We are looking forward to another wonderful year with you - our friends, neighbors, and supporters - as we move into 2023.






